



Find below a few helpful tips that you may to consider when closing out your site.

Members can come thru the season and pay \$10 / Daily. The only bathroom opened is the one by the clubhouse. And there is no cable provided. Complete a Off-Season Power Request form and send it to the office.

- 1. Empty water tanks and water lines. Blow out the water and put in antifreeze.**
2. It is very windy, cold, snowy, and rainy so keep that in mind when you are putting things away.
3. Close all roof vents.
4. Make sure there is proper ventilation between roof and tarp (to prevent moisture).
5. Install 2x4 brace support under your aluminum awning for snow protection.
6. If you have a real toilet (ceramic tank) make sure you empty it completely and fill with antifreeze.
7. Disconnect water hose to the trailer.
8. Shut off the water from outside and insulate the box so it won't freeze.
9. Close your sewer traps.
10. Use Dri Z Air/Moisture Absorber in the RV and place it in a container to catch any excess liquid.
11. Stand up your cushions, open cupboards, and drawers.
12. Leave the fridge door ajar.
13. Turn off your electrical.
14. Turn off your propane.
15. Disconnect your batteries
16. Remove batteries from all electronics, remotes, etc.
17. Brace your metal awnings and Gazebos - wet snow is very heavy, which can collapse under the weight of snow, rain, and ice.
18. Take down any cloth roofs and roll up your blinds.
19. Plug any holes with steel wool to keep the mice out.
20. Don't leave any types of food in your RV.
21. Take away anything that can freeze, paint, cleaning aids or liquids.
22. Ensure that no garbage or green waste is left on your site.
23. Make your lot as clean as possible so things don't blow away or that animals can make homes in.
24. Put your cushions away.
25. Bring in any electrical appliances in.
26. Tie up your hedges to prevent snow damage.
27. Hide your bikes and valuables.
28. Ensure nothing can blow away.



29. Disconnect smoke alarms. Alarms beep when batteries are dead.
30. Retract your slide-out unless they are covered permanently or tarped. Ice can build up with snow melt/freezing and leak into the RV.
31. Make sure your tarps are securely fastened.
